
## Living our Values

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## Mrs Shigdar's Tips for Wellbeing!



### Emotional Regulation

How many of you have heard the term 'Emotional Regulation' and not quite understood what it is or what it means. If so, I hope this helps explain it to you.

Emotional Regulation is all about managing our emotions and behavior, so it fits into the situation and environment we are in at any given time. For example, when children get angry, they may have a tantrum, scream or shout, throw themselves onto the floor. Now, imagine them getting angry at school, you naturally think they will behave in the same way. Yet, they don't. They are regulating their behavior, by staying as neutral as possible to match their environment. As parents, carers and grandparents we can teach our children from a very young age how to regulate our emotions, through role modelling. This is done by them witnessing how we act, how we control our own emotions and behavior, in various difficult situations and environments we may find ourselves in. As our children grow and develop, they become more in-tune with their own emotions and can start to recognise triggers, things that will send them into that tantrum state. This is an ideal time to teach your young person how to 'self-regulate', to acknowledge these triggers and find a calming strategy to help. An easy one to use is the tracing the number 8 on your palm. This is done by holding out your left hand, palm facing upwards and hand out flat. Now take the index finger from your right hand and trace the number 8, lying on its side, on your left-hand palm. As you trace half of the number, take in a deep breath, then exhaling trace the other half to finish the number in full. Do this until you feel you have your emotions under control and regulated.

### The minimum age of use for WhatsApp is ...

We have noticed a significant increase in the amount of issues raised by children and parents due to inappropriate and unkind comments on WhatsApp particularly for our year 4 cohort. The minimum age of use for WhatsApp is 16 and we are urging parents to consider whether this is appropriate for their child to use. We also urge parents to check any social media and monitor its usage regularly so that children sending, seeing or receiving inappropriate messages can be spoken to and supported. ## Chicks!!




