Please make sure you have applied for a place for your child to start school in September 2025 before 15th January 2025. Any applications made after this date will be classed as late applications and you are not likely to get your first choice. We can't wait to welcome you to this event and thank you in advance for practicing those lines and songs at home!

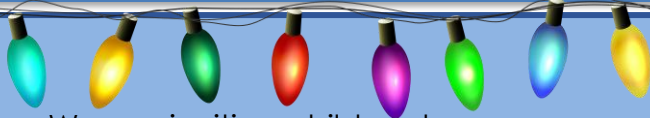
