We are also looking for tyres to use as small world areas and den building resources.

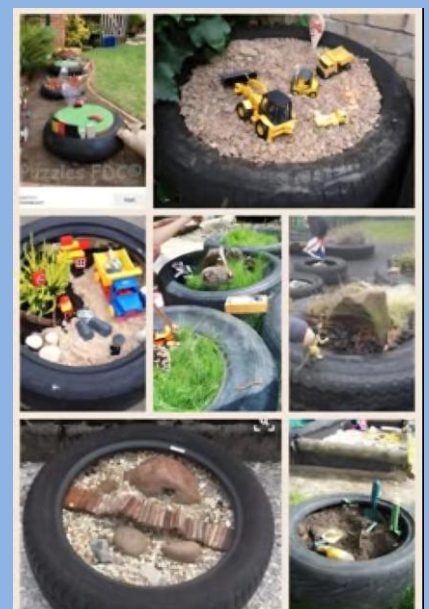
The children have been using and enjoying the new equipment and resources so much in KS1. Playtimes have been more engaging and enjoyable with so much more cooperation and shared ideas.
