Important Reminder: Photo Permissions and Medication in School

As we begin the new school year, we would like to remind all parents and carers to ensure that their child's information is up to date on Arbor including photo and walking home permissions.

If your child requires medication during the school day, please ensure that it is handed directly to the school office and not sent in your child's bag. All medication must be:

- Clearly labelled with your child's name.
- In its original packaging with prescription label
- Accompanied by any required school medical information and consent forms available from the school office.
- Within its expiry date.

Parents and carers are responsible for informing the school of any changes to their child's medical needs, including new diagnoses, allergies or updated treatment plans.
